

Faun Lake Fact Sheet

Faun Lake:

238 acres

300 privately owned campsites for seasonal use from April 1st to October 31st with limited winter access

All sites are 70' diameter circle (iron pin at radius point)

Lakes:

Faun Lake

Approximately 44 acres

¾ mile long X ¼ mile wide

1.53 miles of shoreline

Average depth: 9.3' (maximum 12.8')

Spring fed / tributary to Tonawanda Creek

History:

Beavers built a dam in 1933 creating a 28-acre lake. The Department of Ecological Conservation (DEC) built the present dam in 1954, increasing the size of the lake to its present size.

Uses:

Non-power boats (sailboats, canoes, paddle boats, row boats)

Swimming in 4,000 sq. foot beach area

Fishing (catch and release)

No public access

Beaver Lake

Approximately 27 acres

Maintained by Trails Committee

Surface is brushed and marked

Nature Trail:

Distance 1.75 miles

Maintained by Trails Committee

Surface is brushed and marked

Guest Camping in Camp Coast-to-Coast:

For use by owners' invited guests or members of Coast to Coast

Facilities can be used up to 14 days per year

Water and electric (50 Amp) services at each site

Sewer dump station located off Pee Dee Road

Campers can use all Faun Lake facilities during their stay

Pool:

Depth: 3' to 5.5'

Lifeguard on duty 11am to 7pm weekends Memorial Day through the end of June

Open daily end of June through Labor Day.

Open weekends in September at Operation Manager's discretion

Heated pool

Water quality tested by Wyoming County Health Department
